But native plants face many manmade threats.





Agriculture has resulted in the clearing of millions of acres for crop production (36% of all land, worldwide).




Use of "Roundup ready" crops with herbicides wipes out native plants.

Native plants are threatened by development (2m acres/yr in USA).








Ojibway prairie in Windsor, surrounded by highways.

Native plants are threatened by introduced alien invasive species






